Dear Alessandra

I was in discussions towards the end of last year with Juliette Butler and Sasha Chapman on the repair of the Scheduled and Grade II* Evercreech Cross (NHLE refs: 1016232 and 1059174, Somerset HER 24910). It's in serious trouble through general decay of the stonework, previous stone repairs and a cracked and partially dislodged shaft top and cross.

Juliette had been approached by the Parish Council for Heritage at Risk funding, but I believe this was turned down. The cross was not at the time on the HE H@R register.

Somerset Council recently applied for a SUEZ communities Fund grant for its repair, and this was rejected earlier this month. A scheme of repair has been drawn up by Benjamin+Beachamp architects of Wells and has been tendered.

Could I please have a discussion with you on the potential for including the cross on the register and a repair grant? As background, I have attached Benjamin+Beachamp's repair specification, which includes a condition statement (section 1.3), and a sheet of photos from 2023 (it's now looking worse).

I look forward to hearing from you.
